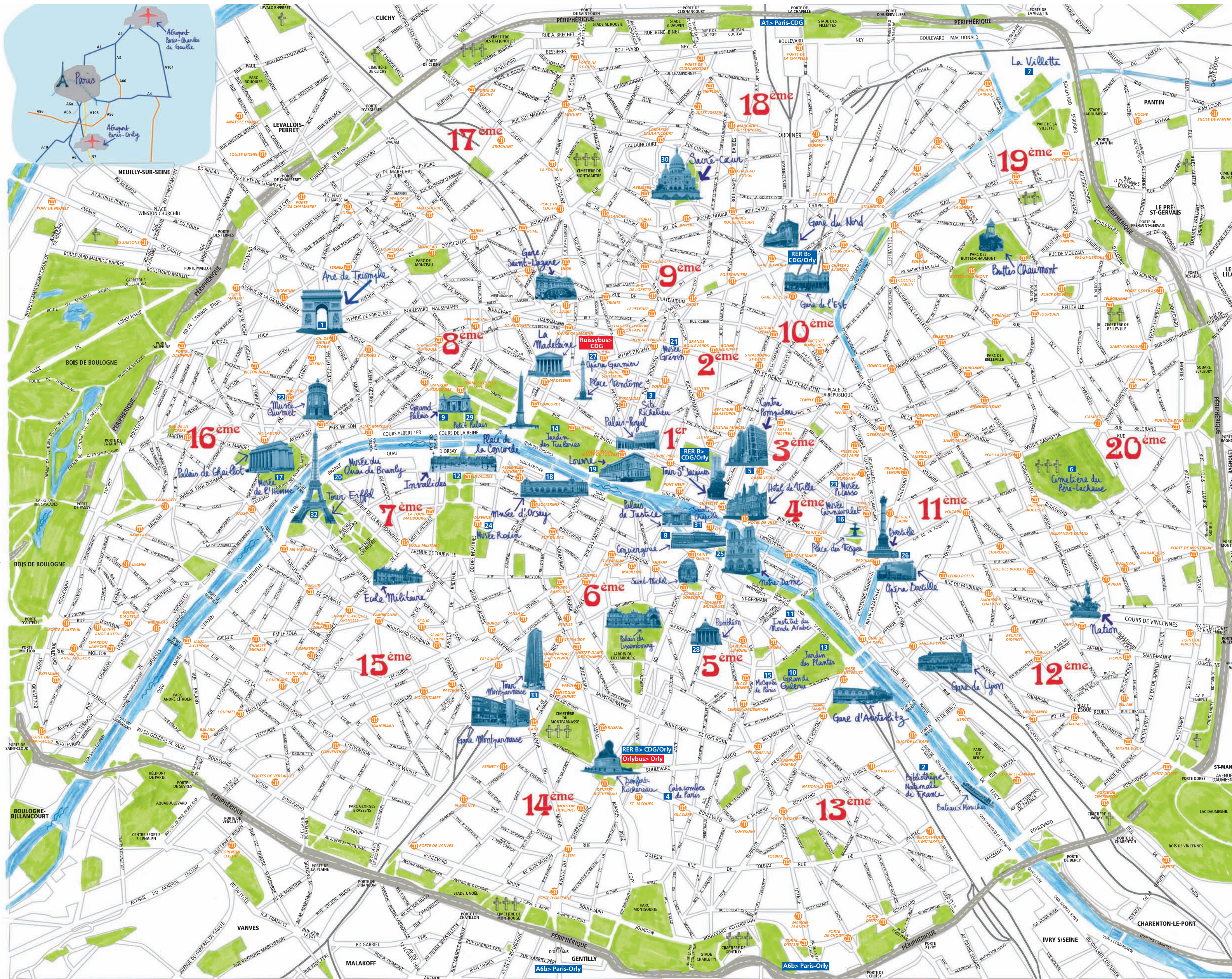

UNMISSABLE PARIS

THE EIFFEL TOWER (7TH ARRONDISSEMENT) | The symbol of Paris
 Constructed between 1887 and 1889 by Gustave Eiffel for the Universal Exhibition celebrating the centenary of the French Revolution, is an architectural masterpiece with a metal structure measuring no less than 324m! Take a vertical tour for an impressive view over the capital and surrounding countryside.

NOTRE DAME DE PARIS (1ST ARR.) | An historic centre
 Immortalized in the novel by Victor Hugo and his Quasimodo, Notre Dame de Paris cathedral, a jewel of Gothic art, never ceases to amaze. It took two hundred years to build, from the 11th to the 13th century! Its recently renovated façades reveal all its splendour and circling its grounds gives you vertigo.

THE SACRÉ CŒUR (18TH ARR.) | Another view of the city
 The Sacré Cœur basilica dominates the Montmartre hill, a district famous for its proliferation of artists: Van Gogh, Toulouse-Lautrec and Picasso in particular lived and worked there. Its forecourt and its dome offer a unique view over Paris, its principal monuments and its countless roofs. Not to be missed!

THE LOUVRE (1ST ARR.) | French splendour
 Since the end of the 12th century, the Louvre's various wings have dominated the centre of Paris. The residence of the French kings for five centuries, it became a museum after the French Revolution. Nowadays a trip to this magical venue, where such famous masterpieces as the "Mona Lisa" and the "Venus de Milo" are displayed, is obligatory!

THE GEORGES POMPIDOU CENTRE (3RD ARR.) | Modern-day Paris
 Located in the centre of Paris, The national centre of art and culture opened to the public in 1977. As President Georges Pompidou wished, this unusual building hosts – within emblematic 20th-century architecture – numerous exhibition spaces devoted to all forms of contemporary art.

LEGENDARY PARIS

THE LATIN QUARTER (5TH AND 6TH ARR.) | Charm and authenticity
 Undoubtedly one of the most authentic districts in Paris! From the Sorbonne university to the Panthéon, via the church of Saint-Sulpice, generations of students and artists have been transformed into museums: The Hôtel Salé (Musée Picasso) and the Musée Carnavalet (dedicated to the history of Paris), can be discovered by turning off its picturesque streets.

THE MARAIS (3RD AND 4TH ARR.) | Romantic Paris
 This is one of the oldest districts in Paris, with its numerous private mansions built in the 17th century around the majestic Place des Vosges. Several of these residences have been transformed into museums: The Hôtel Salé (Musée Picasso) and the Musée Carnavalet (dedicated to the history of Paris), can be discovered by turning off its picturesque streets.

THE BANKS OF THE SEINE | Mythical walks!
 The Île de la Cité and the Île Saint-Louis, book vendors, tow paths adorned and shaded by romantic weeping willows... the banks of the Seine hold some real surprises. And those who love lounging will enjoy Paris-Plage (in the summer) or the swimming pool in the Seine. Relaxation guaranteed!

THE COVERED WALKWAYS (2ND, 9TH, 10TH ARR.) | A narrow escape
 Mostly located in central Paris, the "passages couverts" or covered walkways were constructed in the early 19th century protect well-off customers from adverse weather. Today, the open house art galleries and restaurants. The most famous among them are the Passage du Caire and the Galerie Vivienne, both located in the 2nd arrondissement.
